## PROSPECTUS 2010-11

**From** its very inception in 1953, the guiding philosophy at **Agrawal Classes** has been to admit academically brilliant students and then guide them through a most effective coaching programme so that they achieve the highest scores at the exams. All these years our students have been securing topmost ranks, be it the Inter/First Year Maths of Bombay University, the I.I.T. JEE, the HSC Board or the MHT-CET. This has been possible because of our ability to keep up with the changing trends in the education system and adapt ourselves to the needs of students.

### H.S.C. XII and MHT-CET

Till 1998, admissions to engineering and medical colleges in Maharashtra were based on marks secured at the HSC. From 1999 to 2004, medical college admissions were through Common Entrance Test (CET) while engineering admissions were on the basis of HSC scores. From 2005, admissions to engineering, medical and pharmacy colleges are based on merit positions at the MHT-CET, with a minimum of 50% marks in HSC.

### Our Coaching Programme

Till 2005, we have been coaching for HSC (MPCB) and CET (Medical and Engineering/Pharmacy) separately. However, in view of the new rules, and keeping in mind that almost all our HSC course students take the CET coaching also, we have modified our coaching programme since last 2 years. **We will now offer an integrated course covering the HSC syllabi and MHT-CET.**

**A thorough understanding and mastering of the HSC subjects is a must** before one can apply that knowledge for performing well at CET. Doing well in HSC also safeguards a student against uncertain admission policies decided by various governments. And the training our students receive for HSC and CET, not only does it help them at the state CET, but also at Maharashtra Private College CETs and other national exams like AIEEE, AIIMS, AFMC etc.

### Other Entrance Exams

Parents and students are often confused about various competitive exams they should prepare for.

**The following guidelines will help you in this.**

- Before you plan your preparation, please try to gather accurate current information on the exams that you wish to appear and compare their syllabus with the HSC syllabus.
- Collect data from Colleges (visit their websites), talk to past students, your own professors etc.
- Find out the rate of success, rank-branch-college combination etc.
- At the all India exams, out of lakhs who appear from all over India, only a few are successful in the whole of Maharashtra, because of vast difference with the HSC syllabus.
- Even in exams like AIEEE ([www.aieee.nic.in](http://www.aieee.nic.in)), only a handful of Mumbai students join their preferred Colleges, like NITs (former RECs).
- Also keep in mind that amongst those succeeding at these entrance tests, many are repeaters i.e. they get through only in 2<sup>nd</sup> attempt.
- Do not give too many Entrance exams. Choose one or two major ones and focus your preparation accordingly. And remember, **do not** neglect your Board Exams.
- Come to a realistic estimation of your own chances of success at those admission tests.**

From our long experience in this field we have seen that if a student is focused and concentrates on the HSC and CET seriously, he stands a better chance in getting a seat at a reputed professional college for a branch of his choice, than the one who tries to appear at several entrance tests like I.I.T. JEE, AIEEE, AIIMS, AFMC etc.

### Our courses for 2010-2011

We offer the following combination of subjects in accordance with HSC syllabus, which also is the same for MHT-CET.

#### Course A

Maths + Physics + Chemistry of HSC **alongwith** MPC for **Engineering MHT-CET**

#### Course B

Maths + Physics + Chemistry + Biology of HSC **alongwith** MPC for **Engineering MHT-CET**

#### Course C

Maths + Physics + Chemistry + Biology of HSC **alongwith** PCB for **Medical MHT-CET**

#### Note :

- (i) At the time of admission, student will have to indicate any one course he/she wish to join with us.
- (ii) Change of course or final selection of course (within A / B / C) will be allowed till 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2009.
- (iii) Students should also inform us, the College they have joined; latest by 31st August, 2009.

#### Eligibility

Students securing the following minimum marks in Maths and Science at Std. X exam held in 2009 are eligible for **direct admission**

#### Note :

The above eligibility criteria is subject to revision, without prior notification.

### Admission Procedure

Admission is based on first-cum-first basis.

Admission begin on the next day of SSC results. Admission forms will be issued only at the time of admission. Eligible students should come personally and fill the admission form in our office.

**Student taking admission should come personally alongwith :**

- (i) Original and Xerox copy of Std. X mark sheet
- (ii) 2 recent unattested photographs (3 cm x 4 cm)
- (iii) School I.D. Card or Std. X Exam original hall ticket for photo identification
- (iv) 1<sup>st</sup> instalment of deposit as mentioned under the heading "**course fees**".

#### Note :

- (i) ICSE students may bring either School/Library Card or Passport or any similar I.D. Card for photo verification, alongwith the Std. X Exam original Hall Ticket.
- (ii) Original Marksheet and Hall ticket will be returned immediately after verification.
- (iii) In case a student is unable to produce the original mark sheet at the time of admission, the same must be shown at our office while paying the 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment of fees, failing which the admission will be kept on hold.

### Payment of Fees

At the time of admission, a student should pay the Deposit/1<sup>st</sup> instalment. 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment of Deposit should be paid on **9<sup>th</sup> or 10<sup>th</sup> November, 2009** and balance 3<sup>rd</sup> instalment on **1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 2010**. All payments should be done only by Local Cheque/DD, payable to **AGRAWAL CLASSES. CASH PAYMENT NOT accepted. Amount once paid will neither be adjusted nor refunded.**

### Timings for payment of fee :

**8.00 AM to 12 Noon and 3.00 to 6.00 PM.**

### Fee Concession

Economically weak students who have secured high marks in Std. X public exam can get 10% to 30% fee concession, depending on the family income. Check with our office at the time of paying 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment.

## Course Details

### Duration, Schedule and Timings

**The entire course will be held from end of December, 2009 to May 2011.** Lectures/tests will be held on all Sundays and Public holidays, and daily during Summer, Diwali, Christmas vacations, and post HSC exams from March to May 2011 + a few days alongwith regular college from July 2010.

**1<sup>st</sup> session :** From end of December, 2009 lectures will be held on all Sundays and Public Holidays till **mid-March 2010**, and will continue daily in Summer vacation from **1<sup>st</sup> / 2<sup>nd</sup> week of April to mid-June, 2010.** (till colleges re-open).

### Timings :

**7.00 AM to 1.30 PM OR 2.00 to 8.30 PM**

### Note :

- (i) *Morning/Afternoon batches from Dec.'09 to mid-June '10 are allotted for administrative convenience only and request for change of*

*batch is not encouraged. To maintain equitable distribution, students of Morning Batch will switch to Afternoon timings, and Afternoon Batch students will switch to Morning timings from 1st week of May to mid-June, 2010.*

- (ii) *Students will have **NO CHOICE** in selection of batch timings till mid-June, 2010.*

**2<sup>nd</sup> session :** From July 2010 to Jan. 2011, in addition to Sundays and Public holidays, during regular college days, classes will be held for 3 hours a day, twice a week for Course A, and thrice a week for Course B and C.

### Timings :

**7.00 to 10.00 AM OR 5.00 to 8.00 PM**

### Note :

**For the classes from July onwards, students can select the batch timings i.e. Morning or Evening, depending on their college timetable. This will be done only in end of June 2010, after colleges reopen.**

**3<sup>rd</sup> Session :** After HSC Board Exams till one week prior to final CET Exams, remaining CET lectures and series of CET tests will be held. Revision lectures will also be held during this session.

### Timings :

**7.00 AM onwards for lectures. Morning or afternoon for tests.**

We propose to complete the entire HSC theory portion by July/August 2010 for Course A. For Course B and C, about 80 to 85% theory portion will be covered by July 2010 and remaining portion will be covered before 2010 Diwali vacation, along with CET lectures. However, Tests will be held at regular intervals till January 2011.

**Initially the focus will be on HSC, later HSC and CET, and finally CET.**

**Note :**

- (i) *Course duration and timings are tentative, and are subject to change as per schedule of colleges and the requirement of the course with respect to syllabus.*
- (ii) *As our coaching programme is devised on the basis of schedule of majority of Mumbai Colleges, there is absolutely no scope for any flexibility to students of Jr. colleges attached to local High Schools.*

**Compulsory Tests and Revision Lectures :**

There will be many periodical and end of the course tests. Roughly 75 hours of test writing will cover the HSC style questions.

Answering very quickly and correctly within the allotted time is a major challenge for success in CET. To thoroughly master this skill we have planned for over 150 hours of test answering. These tests will initially be held individual chapter wise, then few chapters together, and later (in April-May 2011) about 15 prelim tests in each subject, covering the entire syllabus exactly on lines of actual MHT-CET.

Our marking of the answer sheets is done exactly on the lines of Board Exam valuation for HSC and CET. Therefore, each test result will enable you to assess your progress and help in planning your preparation accordingly. As all our students are academically gifted and come from over 50 colleges, the relative ranking at our tests is a good indicator of your performance amongst the top 10% of Mumbai student population.

Solution and answer papers for all the tests will be distributed after evaluation. This will be useful to students to revise and re-revise at home till the final examination.

**Attendance in all the Tests is compulsory.** Absentee students will not get question papers; nor will a re-exam be held for them. Revision lectures in all subjects will be held for HSC in Jan.

2011 and for CET in April-May 2011. Only those students who are regular in attending tests will be given the benefit of these lectures.

All our tests till January 2011 will be held on Sundays during morning hours. CET tests in April-May 2011 will be scheduled either in the morning or in the evening on weekdays also. Test schedule will be notified well in advance. The venue for all tests will be **Raja Shivaji Vidhyalaya (King George School)**, Near Ruia College, Hindu Colony, Dadar T.T.

Though all our students make us proud of their achievements, we feel our toppers deserve special appreciation. At our Annual Prize Distribution function, we honour them and award cash prizes and/or silver/gold medals.
